Eating snacks / drinking	Choking / food reactions	Children ideally seated on floor or at the table to assist healthy digestion / adults supervising food / parents need to tell us if allergies. Babies are only fed by adults who have brought them to the group.	Consent Forms are regularly reviewed and updated by Parents / Carers.	Responsible adults	Ongoing	
Children leaving the building unsupervised	Accidents / incidents in churchyard or road	Parents / carers need to be aware that the door may be open for ventilation and therefore need to watch their young people and be responsible for supervising them.	Main door may be closed if the weather is cold or we may decide to keep the door closed whatever the weather.	Leader decides about doors	Ongoing	
Infection / scalding from hot water	A child or others from poor hand hygiene	There's a notice up over the sink in the toilet saying 'very hot water'; parent or carer to supervise hand washing.	Remind parents / carers of their responsibility; no leaders, in any case, should take children to the toilet, for Safeguarding reasons.	All	Ongoing
